

The Forgiving Love of God

We have quite a collection of images and themes to reflect on in this week's readings.

The Golden Calf of the First Reading no doubt sparks memories for some of the epic Cecil B. DeMille film the Ten Commandments. The swirling decadence of the Israelites graphically portraying the capacity of human beings to reject the profundity of God in favour of those fleeting temporal idols which represent humanity's capacity to often settle for immediate gratification instead of the profound. At the end of today's First Reading we hear of God's forgiveness though when, like Abraham before him, Moses intercedes for the behaviour of the Israelites, and in turn humanity. The message that remains from the story, however, is for us to identify those false




idols, which we worship, in our own lives, and to reject them.

The Gospel reading offers us another collection of thoughts to reflect on. The exaggerated example of the parable of The Lost Sheep, and The Woman with the Lost Coin, is meant to represent the superabundant capacity of God's concern for us when we get lost in life and need to be found again.

The Parable of the Prodigal Son, also represents the concern of God, who is represented in the character of the father. Through these parables Jesus is trying to show to his listeners that he understands God. God is like the shepherd looking for lost sheep, the woman looking for the lost coin, and the father watching for the son who loses himself. He also pleads with the elder son to not be resentful. The Pharisees would have recognised what these parables referred to from their knowledge of the prophets of Israel. "I will seek the lost" (Ezekiel 34: 36), and through the prophet Hosea, Israel is described as "the child he loved" (Hosea 11:1). The Pharisees could not grasp the fact that Jesus mission was in accordance with God's; to seek the lost and reconcile them. Thus once again we read and hear in our readings, of The forgiving love of God for those who at times might find themselves lost in life.

Did you know...a peace deal has been agreed between the Colombian Government and the largest guerrilla group, the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC), bringing to an end the longest internal armed conflict in the western hemisphere? Clare Dixon, Head of Latin America at CAFOD, said: "This is a great day for Colombia. Together with our partners we are celebrating this deal as an important step towards achieving peace in the country. We hope this deal

will bring an end to the violence and fear that has devastated the lives of over 7 million people, particularly those living in rural areas; farming communities, Indigenous and Afro-Colombian Peoples."

The Catholic Church plays a key role in Colombia as an advocate for peace and human rights and in the resettlement of uprooted communities. CAFOD's programme focuses on peace-building, protection of human rights defenders and communities, sustainable livelihoods, work on business and human rights, and gender based violence.



St. Wilfrid's Church is undergoing a period of maintenance and decoration. We are installing a brand new lighting scheme, while at the same time undergoing a thorough investigation of the internal structure of the church, including redecoration. During this period the organ is sealed and out of commission, while there is scaffolding inside the church.

The work is expected to be completed by the First Sunday of Advent during which time there will be no **8.30am Mass** in the church itself but **in the Parish Centre**. The interior of the church will be closed to the public during weekdays apart from 12.00 noon until 1.00pm for the mid-day Mass, and from 5.15pm to 6.00pm for the evening Mass. The narthex and the confessional areas will remain open to the public.

Saturday and Sunday Masses will continue as normal. We apologise for any inconvenience during this period of time, but hopefully the finished result will help reveal to a greater degree the architectural beauty of St. Wilfrid's for years to come. Thank you. **SP**
